## Residential Trash Must Be in Containers Households Limited to Five 30-Gallon Containers

The City of Dacono recently adopted more stringent regulations for household trash disposal. All residential waste must be placed in sealed containers. Each household is limited to a maximum of five (5) thirty-gallon trash containers. City ordinance requires rigid containers equipped with lids for all garbage put out for collection. Each lid must be securely closed when waste is in the receptacle. Place your trash out only on your scheduled collection day (or a maximum of 12 hours before the scheduled time of collection).

### Remember:

- ◆ Know the weekly limits on the amount of trash per household: Maximum number of containers is 5 30-gallon containers.
- ◆ Put trash out in proper containers: All trash must be in a rigid container– no trash bags only. All trash containers must have a tight fitting lid.
- ◆ Know your collection day: trash may only be put out on collection day– or a maximum of twelve (12) hours prior to collection.
- ◆ What can *NEVER* go in the trash: Never put any of the following materials in the trash as these materials can harm refuse collectors, the equipment, and the environment:
  - \* Liquids of any type, hot coals, ashes or lit cigarettes, building and construction debris (dirt/rocks, tree trunks, carpets or large scraps)
  - \* Furniture, appliances or auto parts (water heaters, major appliances, couches/chairs, car bumpers, fenders, engine blocks, batteries, items over 50-pounds)
  - \* Unwrapped sharp objects (broken glass should be well-wrapped in newspaper before placing it in the trash.)
  - \* Household hazardous wastes (paint, cleaning fluids, motor oil, insecticides, solvents, acids, gasoline, pool chemicals)
  - \* Medical waste-sharps including needles, syringes, lancets, and other self-injection devices, highly flammable liquids, radioactive materials or toxic chemicals



## City Expands Emergency Notifications to Include Weather Alerts

The City of Dacono is expanding the services provided through its mass notification system– Connect CTY. Now, subscribers can receive automated weather alerts. Through a subscription to Connect CTY, residents can receive automated alerts to specific types of warnings from National Weather Service/NOAA including: severe thunderstorm, tornado and flash flood alerts. ## Comment on Future Plans for I-25

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT), has prepared a Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to identify and evaluate multi-modal transportation improvements along the I-25 transportation corridor extending from the Fort Collins/Wellington area to Denver. The improvements being considered in the Final EIS would address regional and inter-regional movement of people, goods, and services along the corridor. ## Council to Consider Canceling November 1 Election

### 2 Seats, 2 Candidates

The City Council is set to consider a resolution on September 12, cancelling the November 1, 2011 municipal election. The only municipal matter before voters in November is the election of candidates to two seats on the City Council. Two candidates filed petitions by the August 22 deadline and no write-in affidavits were filed with the City Clerk. Filing petitions for City Council seats were Steve Bruno, who currently serves on the City Council, and Peggy Randolph, a resident of Sharpe Farms. Current City Council member Kay Cole is term-limited and cannot seek re-election. City Council members will take their oath of office at the November 14, 2011 City Council meeting. The City contracts with Weld County to coordinate elections. Canceling the election will save the City over \$2,200 in election fees.

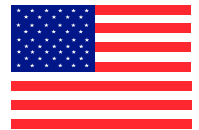
## Patriot's Day Remembrance - September 11, 2011
